A historic 7,000-square-foot tennis estate that architect Donald Wexler designed for Dinah Shore in 1964 has sold for \$4.9 million, according to brokerage Surterre Properties.

The house at 432 Hermosa Place in Palm Springs has two guest houses, six bedrooms, eight baths, a pool, spa and tennis court.

The sale coincides with the 40th anniversary of the Kraft Nabisco Championship at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage.

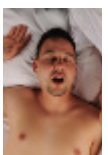
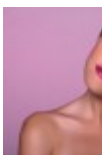
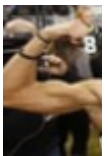
The buyers were Dr. Ben and Jude Lipps of Corona del Mar, according to Rita Kurtz from Surterre Properties, who represented the buyer.
